### **CFD/CMPD Training Academy**

#### **Minutes**

- 8:45 Coffee
- 9:10 Steve Norman, Emergency Management, welcomed everyone to the meeting. He reported that CERT has finished its first training and that nuclear facilities are performing siren and technology upgrades.
- 9:20 Wayne Broome, Emergency Management, reported that the FY2003 Part II Office of Domestic Preparedness money has been approved. He encouraged committee members in need of money for projects to apply for 2004 money to the Policy Group to get approval. In order to be approved, projects have to show countywide and regional benefit. The amount of 2004 money has not been determined yet.
- 9:25 Garry McCormick, Emergency Management, reported on the status of the All Hazards Plan and projected that a rough draft of the Hospital Protection Plan could be done by the May 27<sup>th</sup> AHAC meeting.
- 9:50 Steve Norman discussed the importance of bringing LEPC back to AHAC as an active subcommittee. He also reported that EM is looking into a web-based encrypted system to do web-based Tier II reporting. He announced there would be a vendor presentation for web-based Tier II reporting at CFD's General Office on April 27<sup>th</sup> at 11 am.
- 10:05 David Shimberg, CPAC, reported on the need to get the private sector involved in emergency planning so that it can help and not hinder emergency response. He suggested possibly forming a committee and developing an education-training program.
- Beverly Dickson, CPCC, announced that CPCC, along with UNCC, are working to develop an education training program on terrorism and homeland security.
- Wayne Broome also announced that the National Fire Academy's Emergency Management Institute has home classes for disaster training.
